



Ready, Set, Go! & ISO



The Fire Suppression Rating Schedule (FSRS) contains the criteria ISO uses in reviewing the fire prevention and fire suppression capabilities of individual communities or fire protection areas. The schedule measures the major elements of a community's fire protection system and develops a numerical grading called a Public Protection Classification (PPCTM).

FSRS:

FSRS employs nationally accepted standards developed by such organizations as the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA), the American Water Works Association (AWWA), and the Association of Public-Safety Communications Officials (APCO) International. The PPC program always provides a useful benchmark that helps fire departments and other public officials measure the effectiveness of their efforts and plan improvements.

The FSRS considers four main areas of a community's fire suppression system:

1. Emergency Communications
2. Fire Department
3. Water Supply
- 4. Community Risk Reduction (CRR)**

RSG:

The Ready, Set, Go! Program (RSG), managed by the International Association of Fire Chiefs (IAFC), seeks to develop and improve the dialogue between the fire service and the residents they serve. The program helps the fire service to reach individuals who live in high risk wildland fire areas, and teach them how to best prepare themselves, their families, and their properties against the threat of wildland fire. RSG is a program used by organizations and groups that strive to achieve Community Wildfire Readiness (CWR) by encouraging individuals to acknowledge and prepare for wildland fire threats at the community level. A fire-adapted community requires minimal assistance from firefighters during the threat of a wildland fire as the community and its residents have accepted personal responsibility to seek out information and take action.

IAFC's Community Wildfire Readiness initiatives and associated programs are funded in cooperation with the USDA Forest Service.
